

Woman fined \$2,500 for failure in duty of care

41 year-old Rosario Janie Foong was fined \$2,500 in court today for failure in duty of care to her pet dog.

In July 2017, the Agri-Food & Veterinary Authority of Singapore (AVA) received feedback on an emaciated dog. Investigations found that Foong was the owner of the dog, and had failed to provide her pet dog with adequate and suitable food and water.

- For failure in duty of care, offenders are liable to a maximum fine of \$10,000 and/or a maximum jail term of 12 months for first convictions.
