Consumer Advisory – Recall of Yumi's Brand – Smoked Trout Mousse and Smoked Salmon Mousse

Following a notification from the Food Standards Australia New Zealand (FSANZ)¹ on contamination of specific batches of Yumi's brand – Smoked Trout Mousse and Smoked Salmon Mousse from Australia (Manufacturer: Yumi's Fresh Quality Seafood Pty Ltd, Australia) with *Listeria monocytogenes*, the Agri-Food and Veterinary Authority (AVA) has instructed the importer and retailers to recall all the affected products from the market.

Only certain batches of the products are recalled:



 Smoked Trout Mousse (200g NET) 9317444975315

¹ Food Standards Australia New Zealand (FSANZ) is an independent statutory agency established to set food standards for Australia and New Zealand. The agency works within an integrated food regulatory system involving the governments of Australia and the New Zealand.

The expiry date is printed on the tub. Consumers who have purchased any products of the abovementioned batches are advised to discard them or return them to the retail outlets where they had made the purchases. The products have been linked to a case in Victoria, Australia where an 89-year old male fell ill with Listeria after eating Yumi's brand smoked trout mousse.

What is Listeria monocytogenes?

Listeria monocytogenes is a bacterium, which causes a foodborne illness, known as Listeriosis. The disease affects primarily pregnant women, newborns, and adults with weakened immune systems. Listeria is killed by pasteurization and cooking; however, in ready-to-eat foods such as the mousse, contamination may occur after cooking but before packaging.

Any consumers who have recently eaten the Yumi's brand of smoked trout mousse and smoked salmon mousse of the abovementioned batches and are concerned about their health should consult their doctors.
