

**AWARD OF TENDER FOR LAND PARCELS FOR GENERAL AGRICULTURE  
(FOOD) FARMING AT LIM CHU KANG**

The Singapore Food Agency (SFA) has awarded the tender for one land parcel for General Agriculture (Food) farming at Lim Chu Kang.

2 The tender for three land parcels for General Agriculture (Food) farming was launched on 19 June 2019 and closed on 14 August 2019. The land parcels were tendered using the Concept and Price tender method, where the concept is assessed in the first stage based on production capability, production track record, relevant experience & qualification, and innovation & sustainability. Tenderers who pass the first stage are evaluated on price in the second stage.

3 One land parcel for General Agriculture (Food) farming was awarded to Hay Dairies Pte Ltd. The successful tenderer's proposal incorporated productive and innovative farming systems, including automated feeding, solar panels, and water recycling / rainwater harvesting systems. The tenderer also has a good track record in local production. Details of the awarded land parcel is as tabled:

4 The remaining two land parcels allocated for General Agriculture (Food) farming (LCK 114A and LCK 114C) were not awarded as there were no proposals that satisfied both the concept and price requirements.

5 “To achieve our ‘30-by-30’ goal, it is critical that our farms leverage on technology to level up in terms of productivity and sustainability. In the first half of 2020, SFA will be tendering out sites for farming and proposals that can achieve high production levels sustainably will have a higher chance of being awarded new land parcels. While SFA continues to work closely with farmers to transform, consumers should play their part by buying local produce, which will support farmers and enhance food security,” said Mr Melvin Chow, Senior Director of SFA’s Food Supply Resilience Division.
