

**Mia Food Pte Ltd fined \$3000 for carrying out food repacking activities at unlicensed premises**

Mia Food Pte Ltd, a supplier of snack products, was fined \$3000 by the Court today for carrying out food repacking activities at an unlicensed premises.

2 In May 2021, during an inspection at the premises of Mia Food Pte Ltd, officers from the Singapore Food Agency (SFA) found that repacking of an assortment of snacks were conducted there. Over 600kg of snacks were seized.

3 Illegal repacking of food products at unlicensed facilities poses a food safety risk. In Singapore, all food processing establishments must be licensed and are required to meet SFA's requirements and food safety standards. These licensed establishments are also routinely inspected by SFA. Offenders who illegally repack food products shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding \$5,000 and, in the case of a second or subsequent conviction, to a fine not exceeding \$10,000, or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding 3 months, or both.
