

Recall of "KOO" canned vegetable products from South Africa due to potential canning failure

The Food Standards Australia New Zealand (FSANZ) has issued a food recall alert on a range of "KOO" brand canned vegetable products from South Africa, due to potential canning failure that may result in microbial contamination.

- As the implicated products were imported into Singapore, SFA has directed one importer, Walluco Pte Ltd, to recall the affected batches of the implicated products. The recall has been completed.
- Food products with potential microbial contamination may cause food spoilage, and illness if consumed.
- 4 Consumers who have purchased the implicated products are advised not to consume them. Those who have concerns about their health should seek medical advice.
- 5 Details of the products are as follows:

- 7) Butter Beans in Tomato Sauce (420g)


